The UNTHSC and NTERI have been awarded a large program project VISION grant with funding for 7 postdoctoral fellows. The project involves genomics, proteomics, and neuropharmacologic studies of mouse ocular models of degenerative damage to the retina, optic nerve, and visual centers of the brain.

Postdoctoral candidates must have a PhD, MD, DO or equivalent degree with proven research success. We are looking for highly motivated and qualified candidates with skills and experience in:

- neuroanatomy, histology, and immunocytochemistry
- mouse husbandry and use of mouse models in eye and/or brain research
- genomics and proteomics
- neuropharmacology
