## 4th Annual North Texas Health Forum

*Sponsored by the School of Public Health, UNT Health Science Center*

This event is free and open to the public. Emotional well-being is a significant problem for African American children in Tarrant County. The North Texas Health Forum will present the root causes of this issue in the local Tarrant County community and begin the investigation of approaches to reduce this burden.

The keynote speaker is Dr. Alwyn Cohall, Director of the Harlem Health Promotion Center, one of 37 national Prevention Research Centers established by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to bridge academia and vulnerable communities. He is also on the faculty of both the Mailman School of Public Health and the Department of Pediatrics at New York Presbyterian Hospital. Dr. Cohall's clinical and research interests include adolescent health; reproductive health; access to health care, particularly for young men of color; and the use of technology for health communication/health promotion. He has directed the creation of a number of community outreach initiatives for underserved populations in New York City.
