

BRIAN A. GLADUE, PhD

Brian A. Gladue is the Director, Office for the Protection of Human Subjects (OPHS) at the University of North Texas Health Science Center (UNTHSC, Fort Worth) and also serves as Chairman of the Institutional Review Board (IRB) at UNTHSC. He is also Chairman of the IRB for Methodist Health System (Dallas) and has over 25 years experience in human subject research, both as an investigator and as an IRB member and has previously chaired IRBs in North Dakota (ND State Univ) and Ohio (University of Cincinnati). Dr. Gladue received his B.A. *cum laude* in Biology in 1973 at Northeastern University, and earned his Ph.D. in Zoology in 1979 from Michigan State University. He continued postgraduate studies in Psychiatry and Behavioral Science at the State University of New York - Stony Brook from 1979 - 1981. He has held faculty appointments in Biology and Psychology departments and served as a science policy analyst and advocate (Senior Scientist) for the American Psychological Association (Washington, DC).

Dr. Gladue has over 60 journal articles and chapters in peer-reviewed publications and books; over 100 presentations to professional societies and associations, numerous community presentations and has been Principal Investigator and Co-Investigator on numerous research awards, grants and contracts totaling over \$3 million from various Federal, State and Private Foundation agencies (NIH, NSF, ND, OH, Guggenheim Foundation, Anthem Foundation). He continues to serve on Federal (NIH) grant review boards and panels in the Center for Scientific Review, holds several scholarly awards for research, and serves on Editorial Boards for scientific journals.
